

# Review of 2017/18

The Andover foodbank was set up in 2006 to provide emergency food to local people who find themselves in short term crisis and are without means to buy food. In the year April 2017 - March 2018 we distributed enough food to feed 4325 people of which 1395 were children giving families and individuals valuable breathing space to address longer term issues without the worry of feeding their families or themselves. The supply

of additional products such as toiletries and laundry items helps keep children in schools, and provides some dignity to people struggling within our community. We are also grateful to Abel and Cole who donate fresh fruit and veg every week



### Reason for crisis

Whether it is moving from work onto benefits, unpredictable working hours or alterations to personal circumstances, changes or delays in benefits remain the largest reason for crisis at 38.3% closely followed by people struggling on low

income, 37.5% (an increase from 30% in 2016-17, similar to that observed by other foodbanks). Measured within a 6 month period, 76% clients required 2 boxes or less. Other reasons for needing support include debt, domestic violence, homelessness and sickness.



As in previous years the area with the greatest demand is Alamein Ward and this year we have observed an increase within the Harrow Way ward.



## Partnership working

We continue to partner with over 70 agencies, across the region. Citizens Advice remains our main referral agent, followed by and Children's Services, Inclusion and Two Saints Floating Support. Limitations to the database means we cannot attribute support to specific agencies if the agency worker themselves collects the box from the foodbank, so these are collated under Andover foodbank. We also supported 171 people though partnerships with local schools, making sure that children are not going to school hungry and less able to learn.



### Christmas celebrations

Support at Christmas is very much welcomed by families who are struggling. Again the community donated an amazing supply of good quality gift boxes and donations that enabled 650 gift boxes to be distributed in time for Christmas morning. We are very grateful to staff, children and parents of Bishop Challoner RC School, Wellington Academy, Farleigh School and St John the Baptist School for their generous contributions. In addition, the public also responded fantastically to the 12 days of Christmas campaign, supplying hampers and along with donations from supermarket collections, 317 families and 71 individuals were able to enjoy hampers full of festive treats

including chocolates, mince pies, cake and Christmas pudding. A huge thank you to AMC and the 10<sup>th</sup> Andover Guide group who helped to pack these all in a very short space of time.

## Doubling our capacity to help

Last year the foodbank committee made the decision to stop renting additional storage space and to apply for permission to build an extension to our current warehouse site. We had received a significant donation that made this a possibility and further funding was sought and approved through the TVBC Community Asset Grant. We would like to thank the local councilors who supported our application along with many members of the public who signed petitions, shared their support on various social media platforms or made donations. The build has just started and is due to finish this summer. Our grateful thanks to everyone who supported our move out of unit 9.

## **Funding**

The foodbank has had a busy fundraising year to ensure it can cover the cost of the extension and continue to meet local need. Highlights include the Waitrose Longstock Water Gardens open day, £709.76, an amazing effort from the Abel and Cole team who took on the three peaks challenge in the torrential rain, £1372.50, the phenomenal Dawn Breakers DB-a-thon, £10,000 and our own Andover 10k Lake Run, £7890.54. Total income for 2017-18 was £59,479.01 and expenditure £35,329.

Date for 2018 Andover 10k/5k Lake run is Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> September and it will be opened by Katie Piper.

### **Future vision**

Significant changes for the foodbank over the next year will be the completion of the warehouse and the introduction of Universal Credit which is due to happen in July. Alongside our partner agencies we are preparing ahead for any issues that may arise from this change. We are also investigating how we might support people with gas and electricity costs over the winter period.

The foodbank has also teamed up with Andover Vision, to extend our partnership working to help alleviate poverty in our area.
